In 2003, EFA supported a number of innovative medical initiatives that stand to better the quality of life for all citizens. For example, preventing the overuse of antibiotics in industrialized animal farm operations will help to ensure their effectiveness against potentially catastrophic disease outbreaks (it is also consistent with EFA's environmental mission of sustainable/safe food production). EFA has continued to support eliminating the use of toxic substances in medical products, also an aim that has advantages both to the individual and to the greater environment. Additionally, quality of life implies a continuum of choice that includes end-of-life options; EFA supported the civil liberties of the dying through compassionate palliative care and medical education options. 2003 also saw the continued overlap of Human Services and Medical issues: for example, one program facilitates access to formal systems of health care for indigent women and children while providing them with interim health care, culturally appropriate reproductive sex education, and social services.
